Resolution for Temple Membership

Kazim assessments each year consist of (1) Temple assessments- \$100.00; (2) Per - capita-\$15.00; (3) Hospital assessment-\$5.00 for a total of \$120.00. These assessments are made on total memberships as of January 1 of each year.

The Per-capita fee and hospital assessments must be paid by Kazim Shriners on an established schedule each year, even if still unpaid by the noble.

Section #323.11, Suspension for Non-payment of Dues, states a temple may not carry a member on the books who is more than two (2) years in arrears. The Temple must either suspend him or remit his dues.

It is recommended as of December 31 of each year the member owning the oldest year dues be suspended for non payment. It should be noted, at this time the per-capita and hospital assessments have been paid by Kazim Shriners.

If the member desires to be reinstated he

may do so by completing a Petition for Restoration and paying all unpaid dues.

The Elected Divan of Kazim Shriners voted May 24, 2011 to recommend this Resolution to the Nobility at the Stated meeting August 12, 2011.

The accreditation process evaluates all aspects of clinical motion analysis operation, including measurement validity, accuracy, precision, quality assurance programs, staffing, policies and procedures, and data management. The studies conducted in the lab not only assist in diagnoses, but also provide visual documentation of the patients' progress through treatment.

5. Tone Clinic Offers Range of Care

Patients with spasticity need a wide-range of care and services in order to thrive. This is why the hospital's new Tone Management Clinic offers a clinic setting where patients can be evaluated, all in one location, by a team of specialists in: neurology, neurosurgery, physiatry, genetics, orthopedic surgery, physical therapy, and occupational therapy. The tone clinic is the first of its kind in South Caro-

lina.

6. Less than 1% Infection Rate

Shriners Hospitals for Children® - Greenville boasts a 0.5% surgical site infection rating. Well below the national standard of between 1% and 3%.

7. X-ray System is Completely Digital

The Radiology department became completely digital in 2008 allowing the physicians to see a crystal clear picture and to manipulate the image by zooming in closer on the subject. PACS (Or Picture Archiving Computer System) also provides an easy method for sending scans and documentation to other physicians.

8. Use Omnicell System for Medication Disbursement

The automatic medication management system allows for safe access to medications, while digitally documenting access, dosage, and inventory levels. Omnicell greatly reduces the chance for dosage error.

9. Nurse Named Healthcare Hero of 2011

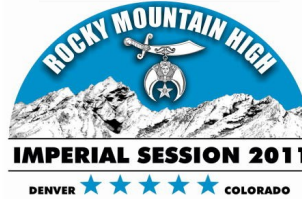

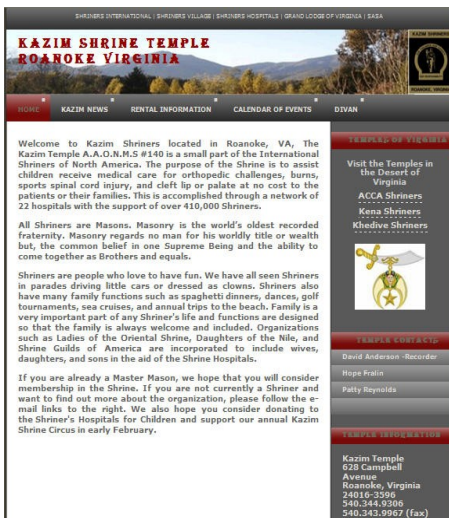
